An emotionally stirring portrayal of homosexual love, THE CONSEQUENCE, a West German film by Wolfgang Petersen, presents a sympathetic approach to the tragedy of lovers crushed by the rigidity of society. This black and white film tells the story of Martin (Jurgen Prochnow), an actor imprisoned for seducing a 15 year old boy, and Thomas (Ernst Hannawald) the young son of a prison official who falls in love with him. After first resisting Thomas's advances, Martin is moved by the innocence and sincerity of feeling from the impetuous youth and they begin an affair. After his release from prison Martin tries to establish a real-world relationship with Thomas, but when Thomas's parents discover them living together they have Thomas imprisoned in a vain attempt to "make a man of him". With dignity and tenderness Petersen tells the story of what could have been a simple love, complicated by the interference of a cruel and hostile society.





1979's "Best Foreign Film" and Cannes' "Best Picture", Volker Schlondorff's THE TIN DRUM brings the glass shattering scream and eternal, infernal drumming of Oscar to the screen. Facing a world of encroaching Nazis and immoral adults, little Oscar decides that he will not grow up. His stunted size allows him the small anarchist protests against the adult world denied to "normal" people. 12 year old David Bennent gives a stunning performance as the boy-sized man with a dark comprehension of the twisted world around him. Gunter Grass's collaboration on the screenplay aids in adapting the ironies of the novel into a film that is as entertaining and realistic as it is symbolic and metaphorical
