In BAD TIMING Roeg again demonstrates that he is the master of manipulating time, memory and even space in films that hover on the borders of illusion.

OUR ER A FILM FROM GERMANY

The Guild has the rare opportunity to present the Albuquerque premiere of Hans-Jurgen Syberberg's magnificent achievement OUR HITLER: A FILM FROM GERMANY. Instead of using documentary films from the period, Syberberg chose a symbolist vocabulary to create a surrealist allegory examining the psychic genesis of Fascism. The scope of this film, the depth and variety of its reference points make a forceful argument that Hitler was a natural result of the basic values of Germany and indeed, Mankind.

OUR HITLER: is really four films: "Hitler: A Film From Germany", "A German Dream in the Night", "The End of a Winter's Tale", and "We, Children of Hell". Using one huge set of nightmarish desolation as background for the extended monologues that comprise most of the film, Syberberg asserts that Hitler was a product of our collective imagination. Discomfiting and disturbing in the closeness of its indictment of each of us as the source of Hitler, OUR HITLER grips the viewer through allusion and fantasy. Parts I and II will be shown on Wed., Sept. 8th, and Parts III and IV on Thurs., Sept. 9th. Tickets for the complete program will be \$10.00. Advance ticket information is available at the Guild box office.


We'd like to call your attention to several temporary changes that have resulted from the extended run of CALIGULA at Don Pancho's.






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
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
